Our dedicated volunteers groom and reline the infields ***before every game!*** The Field House includes a concession stand and clean rest rooms. General Information

Complex Info:

The Nelson Park is located at 6 Prentice St in North Grafton. The complex has 3 softball fields, a Field House, basketball court and a playground. There are no outfield fences. Field 1 has bleachers but you might want to bring lawn chairs for more comfort. There is plenty of open space to picnic and relax between games. Please note that the Town of Grafton prohibits smoking at Nelson Park.

Parking:

The Nelson Library lot is reserved for umpires and our volunteers from Grafton Girls Softball. There is ample parking in the large grassy area on Route 140 across the street from Nelson Park. *Please note that Nelson Park is located within a residential neighborhood. While there is limited on-street parking along Prentice Street and surrounding streets, we strongly encourage everyone to use the lot across the street.*

Field House:

Our Field House contains a concession stand and clean rest rooms. We offer hamburgers, hot dogs and ice cream treats in addition to drinks (water, soda & Gatorade) and snacks (assorted candy, chips, sunflower seed, etc).

T-Shirts:

Tournament t-shirts will be available for sale in the concession stand.

Format:

Each team will play a total of 3 pool games on Friday and Saturday. Results of pool games determine seeding for single elimination championship round on Sunday. Weather permitting, every team will play a minimum of 4 games. We will be using one umpire for pool games, two umpires for playoff games.

Awards:

Team and individual trophies will be presented to the two finalists. Every player will receive a participation pin at the conclusion of their final game.

Roster:

This event is sanctioned by the MASS ASA. Teams must complete ASA rosters and have them available to the tournament director at all times.

Rules:

A complete set of rules is provided in this packet.

Weather:

Rain-outs and rain delays will be determined at the field by the tournament director based on current conditions. Game times and number of games played may be adjusted if weather requires.

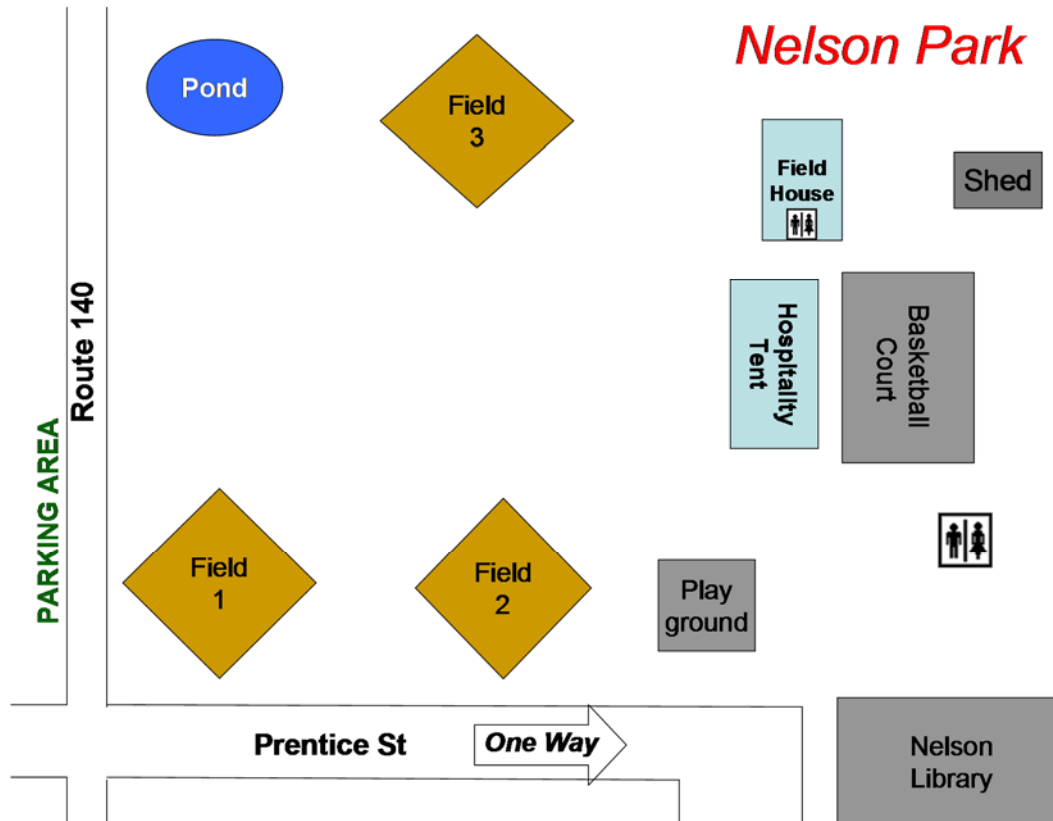

DIRECTIONS TO NELSON PARK SOFTBALL FIELDS HOME OF THE GRAFTON DIAMONDS



Grafton Girls Softball plays all games on the grounds of Nelson Park located at 6 Prentice Street in North Grafton, MA. There are 3 softball fields and plenty of open space. The Field House has permanent rest rooms and concessions. (There are also portable rest rooms on site)

DIRECTIONS TO THE NELSON PARK SOFTBALL FIELDS:

From Mass Pike:

- Take Route I-90 West / Mass Pike
- Take Route 122 – Exit 11 – toward Millbury / Worcester
- Follow sign for Route 122 South
- Turn left onto Bridge Street (Statewide Glass in front of you)
- At light, turn left onto North Main Street / MA-140.
- Continue to follow MA-140
- Nelson Park will be on your right just after Braddish Hot Dog Stand. Parking will be on your left.

From Route 290, Route 20 or Route 9:

- Take Route 140 South Exit
- Follow Route 140 into Grafton
- Nelson Park will be on your left shortly after you cross into Grafton. Parking will be on the right.

From Route 495 South:

- Take the Exit for Route 290 and follow above

From Route 495 North:

- Take Exit 21B – West Main St., Upton
- Continue on West Main St towards Upton for 4-5 miles
- At light, take right onto Route 140 North.
- Follow 140 North for 7-8 miles through Grafton
- Nelson Park will be on your right just after Braddish Hot Dog Stand. Parking will be on your left.

TOURNAMENT RULES FOR 10U

Please note that in order to accommodate town-based teams of varying abilities we have modified ASA Fastpitch Rules as noted below. It is not possible for us to have considered every possible scenario that can arise in a game. Therefore we hope that you view these rules in the spirit they are intended and not scour the rule book for loop holes that can be exploited.

1. Team coaches or representatives must report to the Tournament Director at least 20 minutes before first game. Teams must complete ASA rosters and have them available to the tournament director at all times.
2. All players must wear matching uniforms. Base coaches should be in team colors. Metal spikes are not allowed.
3. Protests must be settled on the playing field before the game will be allowed to continue. The Tournament Director's decision will be final. No protests will be allowed after the game is completed.
4. Teams will play with 9 fielders. Continuous batting order will be used. (So every player on the roster will bat.) Fielders may be substituted freely.
5. Any team not able to field eight (8) players will forfeit the game. If playing with 8, the batting order will list a 9th player. When it is time for the 9th player to bat, an automatic out will be recorded.
6. Games will be 6 innings. No inning can begin after 1 hour, 40 minutes. There will be no time limit for the semi-finals and finals on Sunday.
7. Pool games may end in a tie. If an elimination game is tied after six innings of play, the international tie-breaker will take effect at the top of the seventh inning.
8. Should any game be suspended due to weather or unusual circumstances, it will be resumed from the point of suspension.
9. Coin flip will determine home team for the pool games. Higher seed will determine home team for elimination games.
10. The home team will keep the official score.
11. Immediately after each game, both teams will submit the game result to the Tournament Director (or designated official). It is the responsibility of each team to go to the Hospitality Tent and submit the score. Teams have 30 minutes after the end of their game to dispute a score. After that time all scores are final.
12. The ASA mercy rule will be in effect: 15 runs after 3 innings, 12 after 4 innings or, 8 runs after 5innings.
13. 6 runs maximum per inning for the first 4 innings. No maximum for the 5th and 6th innings

14. Pitchers will pitch from 35 feet with an 11" ball. Only players will pitch; no coach pitch. Pitchers may give up an unlimited number of walks. Runners on 3rd may be walked in if the bases are loaded.
15. For the safety of the batters, the umpire will remove the pitcher from the pitching position in the event she hits three (3) batters in one inning or (4) four batters during the course of the game. .
16. No drop third strike. Players may not advance home on a passed ball.
17. No direct advance to 2nd base on a walk.
18. Players may lead on release by the pitcher. Stealing of 2nd and 3rd base is permitted; no stealing of home. Runners may attempt to advance – and score - on overthrows.
19. Runners cannot advance from 3rd base on a passed ball, wild pitch, or throw down to any base other than third base. The 4 ways a base runner can advance from 3rd are as follows:
 - a. When a play being made on the runner at 3rd results in an error. Normally it is the catcher that will make a throw to 3rd when the runner comes off the bag after a pitch. To prevent that from occurring, coaches should instruct their catchers to pay no attention to the runner on 3rd, and just throw the ball back to the pitcher.
 - b. tagging up on a fly ball,
 - c. safely batted ball,
 - d. Bases loaded walk
20. No infield fly rule.
21. Courtesy runner can be used for the pitcher and catcher. The courtesy runner must be the player who made the last out.
22. It is the responsibility of each team to attend to their first aid needs and supplies. Insurance is the responsibility of each team.
23. Each team is responsible for cleaning their bench after each game.
24. No smoking or alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the Nelson Park premises.

PLAYOFF RULES

Seeding will be based on win/loss record from Friday and Saturday games. 2 points for a win, 1 point for a tie.

Tie breakers will be used in the following order:

1. Head to head games (if more than two teams are tied, head to head applies if and only if the tied teams have all played each other),
2. Least amount of runs allowed,
3. Coin flip. (Or “names drawn from a hat” if more than 2 teams are tied.)
